Following a federal review of Idaho's Brucellosis Program by USDA in September 2012, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA)—Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) Brucellosis Review Team identified "animal movement out of the Designated Surveillance Area" (DSA) as an area of deficiency and a topic that needs revisiting by ISDA. This rule change is being proposed in an effort to comply with the team's recommendation to establish a process to better identify and track the movement of domestic cattle and bison out of the DSA.

IDAPA 02.04.20.123 – To establish a process through which a producer shall be required to obtain a permit prior to movement of any cattle out of the DSA.


