Call to Order and Comments from the Chair; Introductions

Chairman Hughes called the Idaho Nursery and Florist Advisory Committee (NAC) meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Mountain Time. Everyone who called in to the Conference Call identified themselves.

The 2011 annual meeting was held January 23, 2011. Six grant applications were reviewed and approved, some of which were approved via email after resubmission of revised proposals. The Annual Meeting minutes were approved by the committee via E-mail and posted on the ISDA Website.

Review of 2011 Mid-Term Reports:

- 1) NAC/ISDA 2011-1, \$700.00 “A Certified Nursery Professional Training Program for Idaho” - Michael E. Bauer, University of Idaho Extension. (Paid in full on 2/25/11.) Ann Bates said that there needs to be corrections under Objectives; the date needs to be changed from “1993” to “1983” and the cost of the CNP manuals needs to be changed from \$75 to \$50. (Michael Bauer was notified of these suggested changes.) Ann Bates was asked what the home study success rate was of how many took it and how many passed. She will do the research for those statistics for Michael Bauer so that he could put them in his final report to the committee. A motion to accept the mid-term report with the corrections to the report was made by Robert Reggear and seconded by Gary Paulson; the motion was then approved by the full committee. The corrected interim report was returned on 10-27-2011.
- 2) NAC/ISDA 2011-2, \$8,500.00 “Native Plant Tolerance to Several Pre- and Post-emergence Herbicides” - Don Morishita, Ph.D., University of Idaho. (\$4,250 paid on 4/21/11.) A motion to accept the mid-term report was made by Willy Birkholz and seconded by Brian Winn; the motion was then approved by the full committee.
- 3) NAC/ISDA 2011-3, \$13,040.00 “Irrigation and Nitrogen Fertilization Effects on White Clover Persistence in a Kentucky Bluegrass Turf” - Tom Salaiz, University of Idaho. (\$6,520 paid on 4/21/11.) A motion to accept the mid-term report was made by Kevin Allen and seconded by Brian Winn; the motion was then approved by the full committee.

- 4) NAC/ISDA 2011-4, \$22,750.00 “Improvement and Propagation of Native Plants for Water-Conserving and Traditional Landscapes” - Stephen L. Love, Ph.D., University of Idaho. (\$11,375 paid on 4/21/11.) There was discussion about what Dr. Love is doing about the marketing of these native plants. It was suggested that Dr. Love talk about his research on native plants in workshops/seminars at the Horticulture Shows. Ann will be contacting Dr. Love about giving a research presentation at the Idaho Horticulture Expo. A motion to accept the mid-term report was made by Robert Reggear and seconded by Gary Paulson; the motion was then approved by the full committee.

- 5) NAC/ISDA 2011-7, \$13,369.00 “Testing Effectiveness of Four Idaho All Natural Fertilizers/Additives on Selected Herbaceous and Woody Plants” - Robert R. Tripepi, Ph.D., University of Idaho. (\$6,684.50 paid on 6/21/11.) Kevin asked, “How did he determine the initial baseline or starting rates of these fertilizers?” The all-natural fertilizers were applied according to their label recommendations. Other questions were: Why were the initial application rates changed (increased or decreased) and/or a new formulation substituted on the three products (fish emulsion, Kozgro product, Chicken Plus) at the request of the manufacturers/ producers in the middle of the experiment? (These questions were passed on by Mike to Dr. Tripepi to include in his final report.) A motion to accept the mid-term report was made by Brian Winn and seconded by Robert Reggear with direction to Dr. Tripepi to include a detailed explanation in his final report to the committee about the change in application rates on the three products; the motion was then approved by the full committee.

- 6) NAC/ISDA 2011-8, \$11,949.00 “Using Sulfur to Adjust the pH of a Manure-Amended Potting Mix” - Robert R. Tripepi, Ph.D., University of Idaho. (\$5,974.50 paid on 3/14/11.) There was much humor from the group about maybe getting Dr. Tripepi a green thumb and maybe redirecting this to be an herbicide study instead of an amendment for potting soil. A question was asked if the pH of the Moscow city tap water had been tested which might be influencing the results of the study and later was passed on by Mike to Dr. Tripepi to include in his final report. A motion to accept the mid-term report was made by Willy Birkholz and seconded by Kevin Allen; the motion was then approved by the full committee.

Budget Report:

Mike Cooper gave a brief overview of the budget situation. The cash balance of the research fund as of September 8, 2011, was \$96,416.62.

- A total of \$70,308.00 was approved on January 22, 2011 (amount includes later resubmissions); \$35,504.00 was disbursed to the grantees leaving a total of \$34,804.00 (\$4,250 + \$6,520 + \$11,375 + \$6,684.50 + \$5,974.50) to be disbursed upon approval of the final reports.
- A contract payment of \$1,800 was made to the Idaho Agricultural Statistics Service on 4/21/2011 for the 2010 nursery survey.

Mike said the budget has probably gained a little bit since September 8 and will be accruing more by the end of the year. A total of \$34,804 is obligated to the grantees upon approval of the final reports.

Other Business:

Nursery Licenses: As of October 12, 2011, there were 1,819 nursery licenses.

US Clean Plant Network (USNCP): The USNCP funding initiative came out of California and Oregon. The USNCP initiative has several facets to it such as virus-free production systems for grapes, Prunus and Malus. There's also an initiative being worked on through USDA, American Nursery and Landscaping Association (ANLA), and the National Plant Board on a systems approach to nursery certification. It's undergoing some feasibility studies now and there are publication on the Horticulture Research website. It's somewhat controversial across the country on how nurseries will be certified in the future. Some of the bigger nurseries seem to be able to better comply with it than the medium and smaller nurseries. There was some discussion and concerns from some of the nurseries in northern Idaho about it. Ann said she talked to Craig Regelbrugge, ANLA's Agriculture Government Relations and Research in Washington D.C., about the nursery certification initiative. He said they're still trying to figure out just how they're going to make it all work. Ann quoted part of Craig's reply: "USNCP evaluation was an effort to see what advantages and disadvantages are offered by that model. Armed with the results of that evaluation we are considering whether to build a small team of industry and academics to take the results of the evaluation forward and to try to come up with a revised systems approach that may offer a voluntary alternative to the status quo. We have some APHIS grant money to facilitate the process."

Other States' budget cutbacks: Because of state budget shortfalls and cutbacks, some states in the Southeast, such as Alabama and North Carolina, are reducing their staff and their nursery programs to the point where they may have a basic licensing program where the nurseries would buy a nursery license, but the annual nursery inspections may be carried out by Certified Crop Advisors (CCAs) who would then provide a report to the state. Mike said there are not very many CCAs that have a horticultural certification. Gary asked Mike how he was staffed and Mike said staffing is okay, but the budget is not as good as it should be and he has not had time to devote to working on it. The Pale Cyst Nematode situation in eastern Idaho has been all consuming for the past couple of months and will not slow down until winter sets in.

Pale Cyst Nematode: Mike had asked Ann and the INLA to send a resolution to the director supporting the continued program and regulation for containing the Pale Cyst Nematode. A suggested item for Ann to put in the resolution was what happened to the nurseries in northern Idaho when that Pale Cyst Nematode issue was announced in 2006. Mike will provide Ann some language that other groups are using. The seed industry is crafting a resolution to reference some issues that hurt them a number of years ago about another pest that wasn't related to seeds.

Research Proposals: ISDA has received three research proposals that look like they are continuations of previous years' research. Howard said he took a look at them, but unless a proposal was for emergency funding, he was not inclined to go over them until they saw all of the submissions. Bob and Gary agreed with Howard to see the whole group and evaluate them at the main meeting because money is going to be tight and they want to pick the best projects to get the best bang for the buck.

Nursery Advisory Committee Budget: The committee discussed the range to shoot for next year's research grant budget. This year's grants totaled \$70,308, which was more than previous years' ranges of \$55 to \$60 thousand. Mike said the receipts for FY2011 were \$51,721.99, and expenses were \$68,504.70, leaving a balance of \$96,703.62 at the end of June. About \$34,800 is committed based on approval of the final research reports. The expenses have exceeded the receipts for the past two or three years. By the end of January about \$50,000 will come in nursery license fees. What comes in will cover obligations and might add \$20,000 to the coffers. Basically there would be about \$120,000. Years ago the committee talked about keeping \$100,000 in the reserve. There was discussion in the past about only considering or supporting the ongoing programs that we were in favor of, and maybe not taking on anything new. Bob said the reserves are there for a reason, and it's to help us get through some lean years. If we've

got good proposals that will help the industry, should we not be dipping into those reserves? What is the bottom line that we want to be at? Howard said our average project usually comes in at about \$10 to \$20 thousand. If we're going to build the budget back up, we've got to be basically under \$50,000. Everybody knew we were dipping into the reserves, and each year it's because we think this is going to change. Eventually, we may end up being so low that we can only fund what comes in. If something comes in mid-year, then we wouldn't be able to fund it. Do we want to keep one year's reserves on hand? Is one year's reserve enough considering the times? Do we have any responsibility to keep reserves at all? Mike said, you could spend it to zero if you wanted to; there's nothing in the law to keep you from that. It may not be all that prudent though. When the program started, it took two or three years to build up enough money to actually start granting. Howard said that because we are talking about it means we're concerned, and we want to be prudent about it. We'll wait until the January meeting and talk about the budget again at that time. Just know that our income will be about \$50,000 to \$55,000. We granted about \$70,000 last year, and anything over that will probably cut more into our reserves. In the meantime, let's make sure we look at it and think about where we think we should be. In January, we'll review our budget, decide at that point what we're comfortable with and possibly set a target, and decide what we will fund. Mike: There will be a budget page that you can look at when the minutes are sent out.

The annual meeting will be held on Saturday, January 21, 2012, beginning at 9 a.m.

Robert Reggear moved to adjourn the meeting; Gary Paulson seconded the motion. The Committee adjourned at 10:09 a.m.


