## To Whom It May Concern,

I'm writing to oppose adding yews (*Taxus species*) to Idaho's noxious weed list as it serves an important purpose in ornamental landscapes. It is a versatile shrub that performs well in shady areas where other evergreens do not. The yew is not invasive as a plant species. It does not invade properties and is not even found often outside of residential or commercial landscapes.

I understand that this plant can be toxic to animals who ingest it. However, there are many other plant species are toxic to animals and humans. Some of those plants are considered native to Idaho, yet animals either choose not to eat them, or eat very little.

Banning yews creates undue hardships on property owners & nurseries. Property owners would be burdened with high costs of removal & replacement while nurseries would see revenue losses in tens of thousands of dollars, perhaps more. Education is best measure for appropriate use of the Taxus plants as well as any other toxic plant, of which there are many. Unfortunate accidents, such as the yewrelated deaths this past winter, can be lessened or avoided with proper instruction and awareness to the general public.

I have already seen public opinion sway decisions to remove Yew/Taxus plants from the landscape voluntarily which allows the owner the opportunity to decide the best course of action for their property and plants.
