

# Dealer Requirements:

1. The name and the address of the person purchasing or receiving the restricted-use pesticide.
2. The certified applicator name, license number and expiration date of the license for the person certified to use the restricted-use pesticide
3. The name, license number and expiration date of the pesticide dealer when a restricted-use pesticide is distributed to another dealer.
4. The brand name and the EPA Registration number for each restricted-use pesticide distributed.
5. The date of distribution of each restricted-use pesticide
6. The quantity and size of each restricted-use pesticide container and total quantity of each restricted-use pesticide distributed.
7. The pesticide dealer's name, address and dealer license number distributing the restricted-use pesticide.

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# Pesticide Recordkeeping Requirements:

## Private Applicators:

Private applicators must maintain record(s) of federally restricted-use pesticide applications. This information must have been recorded no later than 14 days following the pesticide application and must be maintained for two (2) years following the application of the pesticide.

## Professional Applicators:

Professional applicators must maintain records of all pesticide applications pursuant to IDAPA 02.03.03.150. These records must be retained for a period of three (3) years following the application of the pesticide.

## Pesticide Dealers:

Pesticide dealers must maintain distribution records of restricted-use pesticides pursuant to IDAPA 02.03.03.150 03. These records must be retained for three (3) years.

## Private Applicators:

1. The brand or product name of federally restricted-use pesticide.
2. The product's EPA Registration number.
3. The total amount of pesticide applied.
4. The size of the area treated.
5. The crop, commodity, stored product, or site treated.
6. The location of the application
7. The month, day, and year of the application.
8. The certified applicator's name and certification number

Spot Applications - Spot treatments are especially useful in the control of noxious weeds. If you apply restricted-use pesticides on the same day in a total area of less than 1/10 of an acre, you are required to record the following:

1. The brand or product name of the federally restricted-use pesticide and the product's EPA Registration number.
2. The total amount of pesticide applied.
3. Location of treatment designated as "spot application," followed by a description (e.g., the location could be recorded as spot application," followed by "treated for noxious weeds on Field A, C and all pastures.")
4. Month, day and year of the application.

This provision excludes greenhouses and nursery applications, which are required to keep all elements as listed.

Growers may use their own forms. There is no required federal form for maintaining your restricted-use pesticide records.

## Professional Applicators:

1. The name and address of the owner or operator of each property treated.
2. The specific crop, animal, or property treated.
3. The location by the address, general legal description (township, range, and section) latitude/longitude of the specific crop, animal, or property treated.
4. The trade name or the brand name of the pesticide applied.
5. The size or amount of specific crop, animal, or property treated.
6. The total amount of pesticide applied.
7. The dilution applied or rate of application
8. The EPA Registration number of the pesticide applied.
9. The date of application.
10. The time of day when the pesticide is applied.
11. The approximate wind velocity.
12. The approximate wind direction.
13. The full name of the person recommending the pesticide application.
14. The full name of the professional applicator applying the pesticide.
15. The license number of the professional applicator applying the pesticide.
16. Worker protection information exchange, if required by the Worker Protection standard, prior to pesticide application, shall be documented by.

  - \* Name of the grower or operator contacted.
