Amend the Extended Validity Equine Certificate language to allow participation in an electronic program and modify requirements of the certificate. Amend entry permit language to include the online database. Revise import testing requirements for domestic cervidae. In addition to the proposed changes, IDAPA 02.04.21 will be reviewed for amendment or repeal of select sections in order to comply with Gov. Little's Executive Order 2019-02, Red Tape Reduction Act.	
Why is this rule needed? What prompted this request?	
To revise requirements to improve compliance with extended equine health certificates using an electronic platform and improve accessibility to the public. Eliminate the brucellosis testing requirement for imported domestic cervidae from non- GYA state.	
List any affected parties and potential concerns they may have with this rule. How will the agency involve these parties in the negotiated rulemaking process?	
ISDA will contact the Idaho Horse Council to assist in the outreach to horse owners. Idaho Elk Breeders Association will be contacted to assist with outreach to Idaho elk producers.

There will be no fiscal impact to any Animal Industries fund sources.
