This rule will provide definition for the standards of the now allowable electronic warehouse receipts. It will provide guidance on provider agreements and what will be allowable for electronic warehouse receipts. Also, what standards should be met by the entities providing the programs that contain the electronic warehouse receipts. In addition to the proposed changes, IDAPA 02.02.12 will be reviewed for amendment or repeal of select sections in order to comply with Gov. Little's Executive Order 2019-02, Red Tape Reduction Act.				
Why is this rule needed? What prompted this request?				
This rulemaking is requested to provide support and clarity for requirements regarding the newly added law regarding electronic warehouse receipts under code 69-223.				

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List any affected parties and potential concerns they may have with this rule. How will the agency involve these parties in the negotiated rulemaking process? This change will allow warehouses the ability to issue paper and electronic warehouse receipts. Some warehouses may have concern that they will not be able to use the electronic receipts, but the paper receipts are still available for their use. ISDA will conduct negotiated rulemaking and conduct outreach to stakeholders for input throughout the rulemaking process. Provide the projected fiscal impact for all programs affected, including both positive and negative impacts to all fund sources (General, dedicated and federal): No fiscal impact to agency as all costs if any associated with implementing or related to the use of the electronic warehouse receipts through third party are to be borne by the public warehouse, warehousemen, or commodity dealer.
