Provide a short summary of the changes this rule makes:							
ISDA has a Noxious Weed Free, Forage & Straw (NWFFS) certification program. ISDA is a member of the national organization, North American Invasive Species Management Association (NAISMA). This organization has a national standard for certification of forage and straw which ISDA incorporated into its NWFFS certification program in 2007. In October of 2018, this organization voted to change the name of its Weed Free Forage Certification program from "North American" to "NAISMA". ISDA needs to update its NWFFS rules to reflect those changes. The word "straw" has been added multiple times to address that the fact that straw is made into twice compressed bales, in addition to conventional straw bales. ISDA is seeking to incorporate by reference the NAISMA prohibited weed list. In addition to the proposed changes, IDAPA 02.06.31 will be reviewed for amendment or repeal of select sections in order to comply with Gov. Little's Executive Order 2019-02, Red Tape Reduction Act.							
Why is this rule needed? What prompted this request?							
Federal lands in Idaho have a requirement that if a person possesses forage or straw on these lands, it must be certified noxious weed free. Examples of this: Constituents and outfitters that recreate or operate their business on Federal land and businesses that rehabilitate Federal land with straw. This request was prompted by the recognition that four (4) Idaho businesses could be affected by the name change of the NAISMA Weed Free Forage Certification Program.							
List any affected parties and potential concerns they may have with this rule. How will the agency involve these parties in the negotiated rulemaking process?							
The four (4) companies in Idaho that remanufacture forage and straw will have to modify (two words) the labeling on their products if this rule is approved. ISDA will contact these companies as well as the Idaho Association of Weed Control Superintendents, Idaho Weed Control Association, USFS, and BLM for their input.
