## AGENDA ITEMS

## WELCOME

Scott Leibsle convened the meeting at 1:07 pm. After introductions, Dr. Leibsle explained that as petitioned, this rule would adopt the new Idaho Dairy Nutrient Management Standard to replace the existing 1999 NRCS 590 standard for Grade A dairies in Idaho. This new standard has been developed over the past year by stakeholders participating in rulemaking meetings for Rules Governing Dairy Byproduct and must also be amended in the CAFO site rule and the NMP rule for the standard to apply uniformly across all aspects of the dairy industry.

Marv Patten asked what happens if the Nutrient Management Standard does not move forward. Dr. Leibsle explained that then this rulemaking could be aborted or amended. Brian Oakey, Mitch Vermeer, and Dr. Leibsle discussed the comparison of "risk assessment" for CAFOs of phosphorus threshold versus phosphorus indexing. They agreed that the risk rating is subjective, but agreed to attempt to compare them.

Brian Oakey suggested that ISDA’s authority to revoke certification of Nutrient Management Planners be researched and included in this rule.

Regarding Red Tape Reduction Act, Dr. Leibsle indicated that the suggested changes involve definitions that are duplicated in the statute. Other sections that are redundant provisions would be removed, along with the penalty section. No one had further comments.

Written comments regarding the changes to this rule may be submitted to Dr. Leibsle until June 30.
Scott Leibsle adjourned the meeting at 1:57 pm.
