The pesticides will travel and there is no way to know the unintended effect on farm workers, livestock and residence in surrounding areas will be. Please notify residents when spraying, provide a buffer zone for residence and do not

allow spraying on days with a wind of 10 MPH or greater. While I understand the need to spray, I ask that you mitigate the risks when doing so.
