Ornamental Insecticide/Fungicide (OI) Category		
Why are there changes to the category?	Compliance with competency requirements in federal regulation.	
What are the changes?	No applications to structures, including spider barrier. These applications would require getting a GP category by 12/31/21. You can operate with your current OI license until then.	
General Pest Control Category		
Why are there changes to the category?	Compliance with competency requirements in federal regulation.	
What are the changes?	The GP will no longer cover non-urban rodent control using rodenticides. These activities will require Rodent Control (RC) category by 12/31/21. You can operate with your current GP license until then.	
Other Categories		
Do I have to get a new category?	AH, AI, FE, RW, PH, LP, GP, SP, GV, RC, AP, ST, CP, PC, PC, CH, LPC, WP, SW, and DR are all similar to the previous rule. No need to retest if you maintain your current license.	
On-Site Supervision		
Unlicensed applicator or applicators without relevant category	May apply RUPs with on-site supervision of a licensed applicator. Must complete Applicator Core Competency (CO), EPA-approved WPS handler training or equivalent.	
Supervisor requirements	Supervising applicator must be physically at the site of application, must have visual contact with the pesticide applicator, must be licensed in an appropriate category for the application, and must be in a position to direct the actions of the pesticide applicator.	
What are the changes?	Supervising applicators may not supervise more than two people during any application.	
Why supervision of two people and not more?	Result of negotiated rulemaking. Change is consistent with Idaho Code.

Commercial Apprentice Licenses

Commercial Apprentices	
Why the new category?	Provides flexibility and opportunity to applicator community.
To what does this apply?	Ornamental Herbicide (OH), Ornamental Insecticide/Fungicide (OI), Agricultural Herbicide (AH), Agricultural Insecticide/Fungicide (AI), General Pest Control (GP), and Right-of-Way Herbicide (RW) categories.
What else should I know about this category?	Requires passing the Applicator Core (CO) exam to qualify. Expires on December 31 of the year it was issued. The category is specifically designed to allow the applicator to apply only General Use Pesticides with limited supervision by a licensed applicator.
Information for supervisors	Supervising applicator must be currently licensed in the same category necessary for the pesticide application. May supervise a maximum of two CA applicators at a time. Must maintain immediate communication (voice, radio, cellular telephone, or similar) with the CA applicators for the duration of all pesticide applications.
Professional Applicator Recordkeeping?	Recordkeeping requirements include full name and license number of the professional applicator supervising a pesticide application by a CA licensee. You will have until 12/31/21 to ensure records are updated in this manner. If this does not apply to you or your company, simply denote N/A in the record.
Information for dealers	CA licenses are not eligible to purchase RUPs.

When is it effective?	Beginning 5/18/21. Current licensees have until 12/31/21 to add

Why is there a new rule?	Result of 2020 Legislative Session and subsequent negotiated
	rulemaking. New rule reflects significant input from stakeholders as
	well as changes to federal regulation (FIFRA).
Wind speed restrictions	Pesticides cannot be used in sustained wind speeds that exceed the
	product label directions. If a pesticide label does not state a specific
	wind speed limitation, pesticides will not be applied in sustained
	wind speed conditions exceeding 10 miles per hour.
Law and Safety Category	Now called CO. Required for all professional applicators.
Nuisance flying insects – ag setting	Livestock Pest Control (LP) category now includes insecticidal
	applications to control nuisance flying insects in and around
	agricultural facilities.
Definition of pesticide drift	Rule definition: Movement of pesticide dust or droplets through the
	air at the time of application or soon after, to any site other than the
	area intended.

To reiterate, if an applicator has a current license with a category that included adequate exam competency for a new license category (see above), the applicator does not have to test for a new category unless the licenses lapses (did not maintain credits). If that applicator's license lapses, he or she would be required to take the exams for new license categories. For some new license categories, old categories did not test for some relevant competencies. In these scenarios, applicators have until December 31, 2021, to get new categories. Active licensees can operate with their current category until then.
