The Idaho State Department of Agriculture ("ISDA"), by and through its Director Celia R Gould, and in accordance with Idaho Code Section 22-2404(1)(u) and IDAPA 02.06.09, Subchapter B, herby issues this Temporary Order designating Cogon grass (*Imperata cylindrica*) and sub species Japanese bloodgrass (*Imperata cylindrica rubra*) as a noxious weed in Idaho.

## **FINDINGS**

- ISDA and the Director of ISDA are charged with administering Idaho's Noxious Weed Law (Title 22, Chapter 24, Idaho Code).
- 2. Among the specific duties assigned to the Director are the duties to determine which weeds are noxious, and compile and keep current a noxious weed list. The noxious weeds list is published and incorporated into the Rules Governing Noxious weeds.
- 3. The Director has the authority under the Noxious weed Law to, among other things:
  - a. "Take any appropriate action necessary to control or quarantine noxious weed infestations whenever an actual or potential emergency situation exists concerning noxious weed infestation anywhere in the state; and"
  - b. "Temporarily designate a weed as noxious for up to fifteen (15) months, after publication in a newspaper of general circulation serving the area of infestation."
- 4. Cogon grass: Surveyed by ISDA staff have confirmed the presence of Cogon grass in the foothills area of Ada County, Idaho. These are the first findings of this species in Idaho

and in the Western United States. Cogon grass is a perennial species and has the potential

for rapid rates of spread.

5. In order to protect Idaho from the deleterious effects of Cogon grass and its sub-species,

it is imperative that this species be designated as a noxious weed in Idaho, and that

appropriate control measures are implemented.

Therefor it is herby ORDERED that:

1. Cogon grass (Imperata cylidrica) and sub species (rubra) are herby designated as

noxious weeds in Idaho

2. Cogon grass (Imperata cylidrica) and sub species (rubra) are herby placed on Idaho's

Statewide Early Detection Rapid Response (EDRR) Weed List

6. In Accordance with Idaho Code Section 22-2404(1)(u) this temporary order shall be in

effect for fifteen (15) months from the date signed hereunder, unless revoked in writing

by the Director of ISDA.
