COMPLIANCE DATES FOR SUBPART E: HARVEST AND POST-HARVEST AGRICULTURAL WATER ONLY

As of January 26, 2023, all large covered farms are currently required to comply with the harvest and post-harvest agricultural water requirements of Subpart E. FDA has released a new fact sheet that provides a reminder to farmers of the requirements for harvest and post-harvest agricultural water requirements. Harvest and post-harvest agricultural water requirements for small and very small farms covered under the Produce Safety regulation are expected to comply as of the following dates:

- January 26, 2025, for very small farms;
- January 26, 2024, for small farms; and

ATTENTION NORTHERN IDAHO FARMS!

University of Idaho and the Idaho State of Department will be conducting On-Farm Readiness Reviews (OFRRs) this year in Northern Idaho for farms that have covered produce. OFRRs are voluntary, confidential, free, and non-regulatory visits to your farm to provide a personalized discussion around your food safety practices and the Produce Safety Rule. OFRRs can help prepare a covered farm for an inspection, but you do not need to be a covered farm to receive an OFRR! Qualified exempt or non-covered farms can also request an OFRR. These visits help ensure that you are providing safe produce to your community. Complimentary tools are provided on the visit including a resource manual, recordkeeping guide, and educational posters and stickers for your employees.

ISDA Pesticide Credits may be available for some or all sessions.



INSPECTION UPDATE

The Idaho State Department of Agriculture (ISDA) completed initial inspections for all large, small, and very small covered businesses in 2019, 2020 and 2021 respectively. In 2022, the ISDA began conducting produce safety inspections on a new inspection frequency. Newly identified covered farms will have their initial inspection on the year they become covered, and then inspected according to inspection frequency thereafter. DID YOU KNOW?

Farms are required to notify ISDA any time there is a significant change with their operation such as average produce and/or food sales or a change in produce grown. You can just give us a call, send an email, or submit a new verification form. By providing this information, we can reverify your operation as necessary to ensure that your status under the rule is the most up to date.

Note: Qualified Exempt farms are already required to submit a new verification form annually. If your operation holds a qualified exemption and you have not submitted a new verification form for 2023, please contact Ag.

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
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TRY ME! - INTERACTIVE EDUCATIONAL TOOL
