



What is scrapie?

Scrapie is a degenerative disease affecting the central nervous system of sheep and goats. Like <u>bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE)</u> in cattle and <u>chronic wasting</u> <u>disease (CWD)</u> in cervidae, scrapie is fatal.

How is scrapie transmitted?

Not a lot is understood about scrapie transmission. There have been cases of seemingly healthy animals passing the disease on, but it is not completely known how or why.

What are the signs of infection?

As with other prion diseases, scrapie can cause behavioral changes (such as nervousness, aggression and excessive rubbing), loss of coordination, and weight loss.

What are the testing requirements?

Where do I get scrapie tags for my animals?

If you are ordering microchip scrapie tags, you will be required to have a <u>Premises Identification Number (PIN)</u> in addition to your flock ID.

Scrapie is a reportable disease in Idaho.
