The meeting was called to order by Dr. Scott Leibsle at 1:30pm. Dr. Leibsle introduced the meeting as the second 2026 rule making meeting for 02.02.14.

Dr. Leibsle reviewed where to find rulemaking meetings and information on townhall.idaho.gov and agri.idaho.gov/laws-rules/rulemaking. Public comments can also be submitted to scott.leibsle@isda.idaho.gov until 8/14.

Review of Current Rule and Proposed Changes

Casey Monn gave an overview of changes to IDAPA 02.02.14. https://agri.idaho.gov/wp-content/uploads/2026/08/020214_WM_05222026-Draft-8.04.2026.pdf

No changes to rule draft since 8/4 meeting. Overall changes to the rule include:

- Annual incorporation by reference of NIST Handbook 133 and NIST Handbook 44
- Update to fees for device fees for all device codes based on national and western averages. All updates to fees fall 20-50 percent below national and western fee averages.
- Combining fees for D, E and F, as well as J, K and L.
- Table 1B Updates
 - Lab fees also added in the rule, including the hourly rate for metrology services.
 - Addition of registered service person fee.

- Minimum Fee (016) – Previously the license fee was \$12.00, changing fee to \$150 to cover the cost of the device inspection to account for mileage and staff time conducting inspection.
- Re-examinations of rejected devices, mileage rates and hourly rates updated.
- Updated incorporation by reference dates. Clarified license renewal language. Registered Service Persons licensing fee, requirements, and violations. Rural fuel exemption.

Patxi Larrocea-Phillips asked if the program operates with just dedicated funds or a combination of dedicated and general.

Jared clarified that the Weights and Measures Program runs on both dedicated and general funds.
