

Rodenticides Commonly Registered in Idaho



Rodenticides are pesticides, or specialized tools, that kill rodents. Rodents aren't just a nuisance; they can compromise a home and food safety. Rodenticides serve as a critical intervention to mitigate risks of infestation that can lead to costly property damage or health issues. There are many rodenticide options in Idaho that are available in retailers such as home and garden centers; farm and ranch stores; and pesticide dealers.

Relying solely on rodenticides may not yield long term control. If you deal with current rodents but leave the 'doors' open and the 'pantry' full, new rodents will simply move in. Long-term control requires integrated pest management (IPM) – a strategy that uses more solutions than just chemical.

Chemical control is more effective when:

- The pest is correctly identified
- The home is inspected to determine where the pest is sheltering
- The 'doors' are locked – exclusion; remove their access to your home, secure food sources
- The home is monitored for new activity

After this priority, use of traps and repellants may be an additional tool a homeowner can use. While still considered a pesticide, repellants tend to focus more on deterring rodents instead of killing. Some repellants are registered in Idaho as a 25b product. This simply means they are considered a 'minimum risk' pesticide, often containing active ingredients such as peppermint oil, or corn gluten meal that have low toxicity. Active Ingredients are the substance in pesticides responsible for controlling the pest.

If you need to use pesticides, always read and follow the label carefully. Knowing what the product requires will help you use it safely and effectively. When using rodenticides, start with products that are less risky and have lower toxicity. These general-use pesticides (GUPs) are often gentler on non-target animals. As a reminder: all rodenticides are toxic to mammals, including humans, pets, and wildlife. So, tamper-resistant bait stations and secure storage (when not in use) are important to prevent accidental exposure.

For complex pest issues that may require more robust solutions such as restricted use pesticides (RUPs), a licensed applicator is required to purchase and use these products. If you're thinking about hiring a professional, it's perfectly fine to ask about their reviews, insurance, and professional connections. You might want to ask: Are your applicators licensed? Do you offer a guarantee on your work? A good company will be happy to talk openly about the treatment plan.

Use pesticides safely and responsibly by following safety instructions found on the label, which protects you and ensures that these tools remain available for public use. Be aware how your pesticide applications might affect wild and domestic animals. To avoid any secondary poisoning, make sure to dispose of dead rodents properly.
