PREFACE

The Idaho Administrative Bulletin is an electronic-only, online monthly publication of the Office of the Administrative Rules Coordinator, Division of Financial Management, that is published pursuant to Section 67-5203, Idaho Code. The Bulletin is a compilation of all official rulemaking notices, official rule text, executive orders of the Governor, and all legislative documents affecting rules that are statutorily required to be published in the Bulletin. It may also include other rules-related documents an agency may want to make public through the Bulletin.

State agencies are required to provide public notice of all rulemaking actions and must invite public input. This is done through negotiated rulemaking procedures or after proposed rulemaking has been initiated. The public receives notice that an agency has initiated proposed rulemaking procedures through the Idaho Administrative Bulletin and a legal notice (Public Notice of Intent) that publishes in authorized newspapers throughout the state. The legal notice provides reasonable opportunity for the public to participate when a proposed rule publishes in the Bulletin. Interested parties may submit written comments to the agency or request public hearings of the agency, if none have been scheduled. Such submissions or requests must be presented to the agency within the time and manner specified in the individual “Notice of Rulemaking - Proposed Rule” for each proposed rule that is published in the Bulletin.

Once the comment period closes, the agency considers fully all comments and information submitted regarding the proposed rule. Changes may be made to the proposed rule at this stage of the rulemaking, but changes must be based on comments received and must be a “logical outgrowth” of the proposed rule. The agency may now adopt and publish the pending rule. A pending rule is “pending” legislative review for final approval. The pending rule is the agency’s final version of the rulemaking that will be forwarded to the legislature for review and final approval. Comment periods and public hearings are not provided for when the agency adopts a temporary or pending rule.

CITATION TO THE IDAHO ADMINISTRATIVE BULLETIN

The Bulletin is identified by the calendar year and issue number. For example, Bulletin **22-1** refers to the first Bulletin issued in calendar year **2022**; Bulletin **24-1** refers to the first Bulletin issued in calendar year **2024**. Volume numbers, which proceed from 1 to 12 in a given year, correspond to the months of publication, i.e.; Volume No. **22-1** refers to January 2022; Volume No. **24-2** refers to February 2024; and so forth. Example: The Bulletin published in January 2022 is cited as Volume **22-1**. The December 2022 Bulletin is cited as Volume **22-12**.

RELATIONSHIP TO THE IDAHO ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

The **Idaho Administrative Code** is an electronic-only, online compilation of all final and enforceable administrative rules of the state of Idaho that are of full force and effect. Any temporary rule that is adopted by an agency and is of force and effect is codified into the Administrative Code upon Bulletin publication. All pending rules that have been approved by the legislature during the legislative session as final rules and any temporary rules that are extended supplement the Administrative Code. These rules are codified into the Administrative Code upon becoming effective. Because proposed and pending rules are not enforceable, they are published in the Administrative Bulletin only and cannot be codified into the Administrative Code until approved as final.

THE DIFFERENT RULES PUBLISHED IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE BULLETIN

Idaho’s administrative rulemaking process, governed by the Idaho Administrative Procedure Act, [Title 67, Chapter 52, Idaho Code](#), comprises distinct rulemaking actions: negotiated, proposed, temporary, pending, and final rulemaking. Not all rulemakings incorporate or require all of these actions. For a rule to become final, at a minimum, a rulemaking includes proposed, pending, and final rulemaking. Some rules may be adopted as temporary rules when they meet the required statutory criteria. Agencies must, when feasible, engage in negotiated rulemaking at the beginning of the process to facilitate consensus building. In some cases, the process may begin with proposed rulemaking and end with the final rulemaking. The following is a brief explanation of each type of rule.

1. NEGOTIATED RULEMAKING

Negotiated rulemaking is a process in which all interested persons and the agency seek consensus on the content of a rule through dialogue. Agencies are required to conduct negotiated rulemaking whenever it is feasible to do so. The agency files a “Notice of Intent to Promulgate – Negotiated Rulemaking” for publication in the Administrative Bulletin inviting interested persons to contact the agency if interested in discussing the agency’s intentions regarding the rule changes. This process is intended to result in the formulation of a proposed rule and the initiation of regular rulemaking procedures. One result, however, may also be that regular (proposed) rulemaking is not initiated and no further action is taken by the agency.

2. PROPOSED RULEMAKING

A proposed rulemaking is an action by an agency wherein the agency is proposing to amend or repeal an existing rule or to adopt a new rule. Prior to the adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, the agency must publish a “Notice of Rulemaking – Proposed Rule” in the Bulletin. This notice must include very specific information regarding the rulemaking including all relevant state or federal statutory authority occasioning the rulemaking, a non-technical description of the changes being made, any associated costs, guidance on how to participate through submission of written comments and requests for public hearings, and the text of the proposed rule in legislative format.

3. PENDING RULEMAKING

A pending rule is a rule that has been adopted by an agency under regular rulemaking procedures and remains subject to legislative review before it becomes a final, enforceable rule. When a pending rule is published in the Bulletin, the agency is required to include certain information in the “Notice of Rulemaking – Pending Rule.” This includes a statement giving the reasons for adopting the rule, a statement regarding when the rule becomes effective, a description of how it differs from the proposed rule, and identification of any fees being imposed or changed.

Agencies are required to republish the text of the pending rule when substantive changes have been made to the proposed rule. An agency may adopt a pending rule that varies in content from that which was originally proposed if the subject matter of the rule remains the same, the pending rule change is a logical outgrowth of the proposed rule, and the original notice was written so as to assure that members of the public were reasonably notified of the subject. It is not always necessary to republish all the text of the pending rule.

4. FINAL RULEMAKING

A final rule is a rule that has been adopted by an agency under the regular rulemaking procedures, has been approved by the legislature, and is of full force and effect.

5. TEMPORARY RULEMAKING

Temporary rules may be adopted only when the governor finds that:

- a) an imminent threat to the public health, safety, or welfare from a specified danger that was unknown to the agency prior to or during the most recent session of the legislature or from the measurable worsening of such threat or danger;
- b) compliance with deadlines in amendments to governing law;
- c) reducing a regulatory burden that would otherwise impact individuals or businesses;
- d) protection of citizens’ rights; or
- e) a natural disaster.

If a rulemaking meets one or more of these criteria, the Governor must publish a statement as to why an earlier effective date is required prior to receiving legislative authorization. The agency may then adopt a temporary rule to make it immediately effective or choose a later effective date. A temporary rule expires at the conclusion of the next succeeding regular legislative session unless the rule is extended by concurrent resolution, is replaced by a final rule, or expires under its own terms or operation of law. An agency cannot adopt the same or substantially similar temporary rule unless (a) the Governor finds it is necessary due to an imminent threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, (b) 90 days have elapsed since the previous rule expiration, or (c) the Governor issues a declaration of a disaster emergency in state law. Agencies must concurrently promulgate a temporary rule and a proposed rule showing changes from the final rule when the text of the two rulemakings is the same, unless the temporary rule will expire before a proposed rule could become final.

HOW TO USE THE IDAHO ADMINISTRATIVE BULLETIN

Rulemaking documents produced by state agencies and published in the **Idaho Administrative Bulletin** are organized by a numbering schematic. Each state agency has a two-digit identification code number known as the “**IDAPA**” number. (The “IDAPA” Codes are listed in the alphabetical/numerical index at the end of this Preface.) Within each agency there are divisions or sections to which a two-digit “TITLE” number is assigned. There are “CHAPTER” numbers assigned within the Title and the rule text is divided among major sections that are further subdivided into subsections. An example IDAPA number is as follows:

IDAPA 38.05.01.041.02.c.ii.

“**IDAPA**” refers to Administrative Rules in general that are subject to the Administrative Procedures Act and are required by this act to be published in the Idaho Administrative Code and the Idaho Administrative Bulletin.

“**38.**” refers to the Idaho Department of Administration

“**05.**” refers to Title **05**, which is the Department of Administration’s Division of Purchasing

“**01.**” refers to Chapter **01** of Title **05**, “Rules of the Division of Purchasing”

“**041.**” refers to Major Section **041**, “Acquisition Procedures”

“**02.**” refers to Subsection **041.02**.

“**c.**” refers to Subsection **041.02.c**.

“**ii.**” refers to Subsection **041.02.c.ii**.

DOCKET NUMBERING SYSTEM

Internally, the Bulletin is organized sequentially using a rule docketing system. Each rulemaking that is filed with the Coordinator is assigned a “DOCKET NUMBER.” The docket number is a series of numbers separated by a hyphen “-”, (**38-0501-2201**). Rulemaking dockets are published sequentially by IDAPA number (the two-digit agency code) in the Bulletin. The following example is a breakdown of a typical rule docket number:

“DOCKET NO. 38-0501-2201”

“**38-**” denotes the agency's **IDAPA** number; in this case the Department of Administration.

“**0501-**” refers to the **TITLE AND CHAPTER** numbers of the agency rule being promulgated; in this case the Division of Purchasing (TITLE **05**), Rules of the Division of Purchasing (Chapter **01**).

“**2201**” denotes the year and sequential order of the docket being published; in this case the numbers refer to the first rulemaking action published in **calendar year 2022**. A subsequent rulemaking on this same rule chapter in calendar year 2022 would be designated as “**2202**”. The docket number in this scenario would be 38-0501-**2202**.

Within each Docket, only the affected sections of chapters are printed. (See **Sections Affected Index** in each Bulletin for a listing of these.) The individual sections affected are printed in the Bulletin sequentially (e.g. Section “200” appears before Section “345” and so on). Whenever the sequence of the numbering is broken, the following statement will appear:

**PROMOTING TRANSPARENT, TIMELY, AND GOOD-FAITH INFORMATION SHARING
BETWEEN EXECUTIVE AND LEGISLATIVE BRANCHES**

WHEREAS, the Constitution of the State vests the executive power of the State in the Governor and charges the Governor with ensuring that the laws are faithfully executed; and

WHEREAS, the effective administration of State government requires appropriate good-faith communications and coordination between the executive and legislative branches; and

WHEREAS, members of the State Legislature regularly require access to records, information, and data maintained by executive agencies in order to carry out their legislative responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, executive agencies maintain records, information, and data that are necessary for informed policymaking, legislative analysis, and the evaluation of the effectiveness of State programs and services; and

WHEREAS, the timely, consistent, and complete sharing of records, information, and data in good faith between executive agencies and members of the Legislature promotes transparency, accountability, and informed decision making; and

WHEREAS, it is therefore appropriate to establish guidelines governing the manner in which executive agencies provide records, information, and data to members of the Legislature and its staff.

NOW, THEREFORE I, Brad Little, Governor of the State of Idaho, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this state do hereby order:

- 1. All executive departments, offices, and institutions of the State (agencies) shall designate a staff member to serve as the point of contact (POC) for all legislative requests for records, information, and data. The POC must be familiar with and have a working knowledge of the records, information, and data maintained by the agency.*
- 2. Absent a legislative request for records, information, or data, an agency employee may in good faith provide records, information, or data directly to a legislator or legislative staff for the purpose of enabling a legislator to make fully informed policy decisions. Agency employees may voluntarily notify the POC of records, information, or data provided directly to a legislator or legislative staff for purposes of agency awareness and coordination.*
- 3. All legislative requests for records, information, or data received by an agency employee other than the POC shall immediately be forwarded to the POC upon receipt.*
- 4. The POC shall route each legislative request to those agency employees responsible for the requested records, information, or data, as well as the agency head (director or administrator), as soon as possible and within no later than twenty-four (24) hours*
- 5. The agency head shall immediately inform the agency's DFM analyst and Governor's Office contact of all legislative requests received.*

6. *Unless a different deadline is specified in the legislative request, the POC shall acknowledge receipt of the request on behalf of the agency within three (3) working days and shall provide a substantive response within ten (10) working days of receipt. All reasonable efforts shall be made to respond to the request without unnecessarily using the entire ten (10) day response period.*
7. *If the agency cannot reasonably provide a substantive response within ten (10) working days, the POC shall within that period provide written notice to the requestor explaining the reason for delay and provide a date certain for a response not to exceed an additional ten (10) working days, absent extraordinary circumstances.*
8. *A substantive response may include records, data, explanations, analysis, or other information responsive to the request, including identification of information not maintained by the agency.*
9. *Nothing in this executive order requires or authorizes the disclosure of records, information, or data made confidential by State or federal law or otherwise exempt from disclosure under the Idaho Public Records Act. In the event of any redaction or non-disclosure of records, the agency shall identify the legal basis for redaction or nondisclosure and provide any reasonably segregable nonconfidential records in accordance with the Idaho Public Records Act.*

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2026-05

CREATION OF THE STATE WORKFORCE PELL COORDINATING COUNCIL

WHEREAS, on July 4, 2025, President Trump signed H.R.1 – the One Big Beautiful Bill Act – which established the Workforce Pell Grant program by expanding the federal Pell Grant framework to include high-quality, short-term workforce training programs; and

WHEREAS, this expansion allows eligible students to use Pell Grants for programs that are shorter than traditional degree pathways but lead to recognized postsecondary credentials aligned with in-demand occupations; and

WHEREAS, the creation of a Workforce Pell Grant program builds on the great success of Idaho LAUNCH by providing additional financial aid options for those who need it most; and

WHEREAS, H.R. 1 grants Governors the primary role in determining whether educational programs within their state meet workforce alignment requirements, ensuring coordination between higher education providers and state labor market priorities; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of Idahoans that we act quickly but thoughtfully to implement this provision of the One Big Beautiful Bill Act.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Brad Little, Governor of the State of Idaho, pursuant to the Constitution and laws of Idaho, do hereby order the following:

- 1. The State Workforce Pell Coordinating Council (“SWPCC”) is established to oversee the implementation of the Workforce Pell Grant program.*
- 2. The SWPCC shall be responsible for the following:*
 - a. Recommending statewide Workforce Pell eligibility and policy criteria to the Idaho Workforce Development Council (“WDC”)*
 - b. Implementing WDC policy to maintain an Eligible Program Registry*
 - c. Overseeing performance monitoring and accountability for all approved programs*
 - d. Coordinating federal compliance and representing Idaho in any reviews by the U.S. Department of Education*
 - e. Issuing guidance to institutions of higher education, regional entities, and education provider partners*
 - f. Recommending and executing enforcement actions, including probation, suspension, and removal*
 - g. Reviewing and recommending programs for approval or removal to the Governor*
- 3. The SWPCC shall function as an interagency administrative body and shall consist of the following members:*
 - a. The Administrator of the Idaho Division of Career Technical Education or a designee chosen by the Administrator to serve as a Co-Chair and voting member*
 - b. The Executive Director of the Idaho Workforce Development Council or a designee chosen by the Executive Director to serve as a Co-Chair and voting member*

- c. *The Executive Director of the Office of the State Board of Education or a designee chosen by the Executive Director to serve as a voting member*
 - d. *A staff member of the Office of the Governor to serve as a voting member*
4. *The SWPCC is authorized to include, as non-voting members, representatives from the Idaho Department of Labor; institutions of higher education and other data liaisons for the purpose of providing technical assistance.*

- 3. The Division of Human Resources shall provide guidance as necessary for the implementation of this order. Agency directors are authorized to take reasonable steps to ensure uninterrupted delivery of critical services while carrying out the intent of this order.*

All Idahoans are encouraged to participate in America250 activities throughout the year, honor the generations who secured and preserved our freedoms, and recommit themselves to the enduring ideals that have made the United States a beacon of liberty and opportunity for 250 years.

As we celebrate this historic anniversary, we recognize that the American story is one of courage, perseverance, innovation, and faith in the promise of freedom. May this milestone inspire gratitude for our nation's past and confidence in its future.

**OMNIBUS NOTICE OF LEGISLATIVE ACTION – SUMMARY OF ACTION
TAKEN ON PENDING, TEMPORARY, AND FINAL RULES**

AUTHORITY: In compliance with Sections 67-5224(6), 67-5226(3), and 67-5291, Idaho Code, the Administrative Rules Coordinator hereby provides notice that the Second Regular Session of the 68th Idaho Legislature adjourned Sine Die on April 2, 2026, and that the standing committees completed the review of certain administrative rules of the state agencies of the executive branch. Additionally, in compliance with Section 67-5291, Idaho Code, this notice also serves as official notice of final rulemaking for those state agencies whose rules have been approved as final. Also, notice is hereby given that certain previously approved final rules were revoked by enacted legislation of the legislature. These rules are null, void, and of no force and effect.

DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY: The following is a brief description of the action taken by the standing committees of the legislature during the 2026 legislative session.

The Administrative Procedures Act (APA) requires that all pending rules be reviewed and approved by concurrent resolution of the legislature in order for the pending rule to become final and effective. The standing committees of the legislature have reviewed the pending rules submitted for review and final approval. A pending rule that is not approved by a concurrent resolution shall expire upon adjournment sine die of the legislative session during which the agency submits the pending rule to the legislature for review.

Pending rules reviewed by the legislature that were approved are now final and of full force and effect. Section 67-5291, Idaho Code, requires a concurrent resolution of the legislature to approve or reject a pending rule that doesn't meet legislative intent based on finding of facts as to why the rule does not meet the legislative intent of the enabling statute by identifying how the rule is inconsistent with the authority granted by or the requirements of the corresponding section of Idaho Code. Any pending rule that was properly rejected pursuant to the APA in whole or in part is listed in this notice with the corresponding house or senate concurrent resolution affecting it. Pending rule dockets that were properly rejected in whole or any parts of any pending rule that were properly rejected, are null, void, and of no force and effect. Those rules that were acted on and approved by concurrent resolution became final and of full force and effect upon July 1, 2026, unless otherwise specified in the concurrent resolution.

In accordance with Section 67-5291(1), Idaho Code, all temporary rules that were submitted for extension have been reviewed. Temporary rules that were reviewed and extended will continue to be of full force and effect until the end of the next legislative session, unless they expire under their own terms or other provision of law, or are rescinded, and any part of a temporary rule that was rejected is declared null, void and of no force and effect. Those temporary rules that were properly rejected in their entirety are null, void and of no force and effect.

TEMPORARY, PENDING, AND FINAL RULES: The following tables list all temporary and pending rulemakings that were submitted for legislative review during the 2026 legislative session. The list includes the docket number of each temporary and pending rulemaking, the volume number of the Bulletin in which the proposed, pending, and temporary rule notices and text were published, the final effective dates of all approved pending rules, the effective dates of any temporary rules, and the number of the senate or house concurrent resolution, if applicable, affecting the rulemaking. These tables provide final status of all pending and temporary rules submitted for legislative review. Final rules that were acted on by the legislature rejecting previously approved rule text are listed along with their corresponding concurrent resolution or enacted legislation.

DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY: The following is the required finding and concise statement of its supporting reasons for adopting a temporary rule and a nontechnical explanation of the substance and purpose of the proposed rulemaking:

Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) is tasked with establishing the requirements for basic training and certification, providing academy and in-service training, issuing certifications, and maintaining permanent files and transcripts for all law enforcement officers in the State of Idaho. POST is also responsible for conducting decertification investigations of officers who violate standards of conduct as established by the POST Council’s code of ethics. This rule must be adopted to allow POST to carry out the statutory duties of providing training and certification to the law enforcement officers who provide public safety services to the citizens of the State of Idaho.

This rule change reduces the regulatory burden that would otherwise impact individuals or businesses, specifically juvenile justice officers. By combining two separate disciplines into one, officers can be trained and certified in the new, single discipline (Juvenile Justice Officer), reducing the need to manage certification and training of two disciplines and no longer requiring officers to attend an additional basic training academy to attain certification when transitioning from one discipline to the other, i.e. Juvenile Detention Officer to Juvenile Corrections Officer.

FISCAL IMPACT: The following is a specific description, if applicable, of any negative fiscal impact on the state general fund greater than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) during the fiscal year: NA.

NEGOTIATED RULEMAKING: Pursuant to Idaho Code Section [67-5220\(2\)](#) negotiated rulemaking was not conducted because of time constraints associated with the POST Council implementing these provisions to allow for certification of law enforcement officers. 010. DEFINITIONS.

In addition to the definitions under 19-5101, Idaho Code, the following terms apply: (3-31-22)

01. Act. Title 19, Chapter 51, of the Idaho Code. (3-31-22)

02. Agency. A law enforcement agency which is a part of or administered by the state of Idaho or any political subdivision thereof and which is responsible for the prevention and detection of crime and the enforcement of penal, traffic or highway laws of this state or any political subdivision; a juvenile detention center; a juvenile probation department; an adult misdemeanor probation department, a Public-Safety Answering Point (PSAP); the Idaho Department of Juvenile Corrections; the Idaho Department of Correction; or a private prison contractor of the

State Board of Correction that is responsible for the first-line supervision, security, protection, and risk reduction of offenders housed in the a private correctional facility. (3-31-22)

03. Agency Head. A chief of police of a city, sheriff of a county or chief administrator of a law enforcement agency, as defined herein. (3-31-22)

04. Applicant. A person applying to participate in a POST training program or applying for POST certification. (3-31-22)

05. Basic Training Academy. A basic course of Council approved instruction in a discipline certified by POST. (3-31-22)

06. Canine Team. A specific person and a specific dog controlled by that person as its handler, formally assigned to perform law enforcement duties together. (3-31-22)

07. Canine Team Evaluator. An officer trained and certified by POST to evaluate the competence of canine teams. (3-31-22)

08. College Credit. A unit of work toward an academic or vocational degree awarded by a college or university accredited by one of the accrediting agencies listed in Subsection 11.11.01.053.01.d. or other POST accepted U.S. regional accrediting agency. (3-31-22)

09. Conviction. Any conviction in any federal, tribal, state, county, or municipal court; a voluntary forfeiture of bail, bond, or collateral deposited to secure a defendant's appearance in court as final disposition; the payment of a fine or civil penalty; a plea of guilty or nolo contendere; or a finding of guilt, notwithstanding the form of judgment or withheld judgment, regardless of whether the sentence is imposed, suspended, deferred, or withheld, or whether the plea or conviction is set aside or withdrawn, or the case or charge is dismissed or reduced, or the record expunged under Section 19-2604, Idaho Code, or any other comparable statute or procedure, where the setting aside of the plea or conviction, or dismissal or reduction of the case or charge, or expungement of the record is based upon lenity or rehabilitation rather than upon a defect in the legality or factual basis of the plea, finding of guilt, or conviction. "Conviction" does not include a misdemeanor conviction upon a bond forfeiture for a violation that is or would at the time have in Idaho been an infraction violation, if the only reason it is classified as a misdemeanor is due to the bond forfeiture. 10. Correction Officer. An employee of the Idaho Department of Correction or a private prison contractor of the State Board of Correction who is responsible for the first-line supervision, security, protection, and risk reduction of offenders housed in a correction facility. (3-31-22)

11. Council. The Idaho Peace Officer Standards and Training Council. (3-31-22)

12. Crime of Deceit. Any offense described in Section 18-1301 et seq., Idaho Code, (Bribery), Section 18-1401 et seq. 13. Division Administrator. The administrator of the Idaho Peace Officers Standards and Training Division of the Idaho State Police. (3-31-22)

14. Field Training. Formal, on the job training for special and defined purposes. (3-31-22)

15. Full Time. An employee who is, for a calendar month, employed on average at least thirty (30) hours of service per week, or one hundred thirty (130) hours of service per month. (3-31-22)

16. Hearing Board. A board of three members designated by the Chair of the Council to hear contested cases and enter recommended orders for the Council's decision. (3-31-22)

17. Hearing Officer. A person designated by the Council to preside over decertification proceedings and to render findings of fact, conclusions of law and a recommended order at the conclusion of those proceedings. (3-31-22)

18. In-Service Training. Training designed to refresh or enhance a certified officer's ability to perform their duties. (3-31-22)

19. Juvenile Detention Center. A facility that is part of or administered by an Idaho county and is responsible for the safety, care, protection, and monitoring of juvenile offenders. (3-31-22)

20. Juvenile Detention Officer. An employee working in a juvenile detention center who is responsible for the safety, care, protection, and monitoring of juvenile offenders. (3-31-22)

21. Juvenile Justice Officer. An employee working in a juvenile detention center or in a correctional facility operated by the Idaho Department of Juvenile Corrections, who is responsible for the safety, care, protection, and monitoring of juvenile offenders. (7-1-26)T

22. Juvenile Probation Department. A public or private agency administered by or contracted with the court, and providing juvenile probation services to a county at the concurrence and expense of the county commissioners. (3-31-22)

23. Juvenile Probation Officer. An employee of a juvenile probation department who is responsible for preparing social history reports to the court, making recommendations regarding conditions of probation, and the supervision of juvenile offenders' compliance with court orders. (3-31-22)

24. Law Enforcement Certification Program. A program operated by a college or university, law enforcement agency, or private entity and satisfying POST basic training academy requirements. (3-31-22)

245. Law Enforcement Certification Program Facility. A facility at which law enforcement certification programs conduct training. (3-31-22)

256. Law Enforcement Profession. As used in these rules in reference to agreements authorized pursuant to Section 19-5112, Idaho Code, the “law enforcement profession” includes the following positions: Peace Officer, County Detention Officer, Emergency Communications Officer, Juvenile Detention Officer, Juvenile Justice Officer, Juvenile Probation Officer, Correction Officer, Juvenile Corrections Direct Care Staff, Adult Felony Probation and Parole Officer, Idaho Department of Juvenile Corrections Direct Care Staff, and Adult Misdemeanor Probation Officer. ~~(3-31-22)~~ (7-1-26)T

267. Marine Deputy. A person employed by a county sheriff whose primary function is to perform marine-related enforcement duties within established policies and procedures. (3-31-22)

278. Misdemeanor Probation Department. A public or private agency administered by or contracted with the county, and providing misdemeanor probation services to a county at the concurrence and expense of the county commissioners. (3-31-22)

289. Part-Time Employee. An employee, regardless of discipline, who works less than thirty (30) hours per week or one hundred thirty (130) hours per month. (3-31-22)

2930. POST. The Idaho Peace Officer Standards and Training Program. (3-31-22)

301. POST Certified Instructor. A person certified by POST as qualified to instruct or assess students in a course of instruction which meets POST standards for certification or training. (3-31-22)

(3-31-22)

03. Voluntary Certification for Emergency Communications Officers Employed Prior to July 1, 2012. Emergency Communications Officers who were employed prior to July 1, 2012 are not required to be POST certified, but may become certified by meeting all requirements for certification set forth in these rules. (3-31-22)

04. Voluntary Certification for Certain Officials. The statute changed the primary residential exemption structure from a partial-year or full-year calculation to a strict full-year-only timeframe. The rule is being updated to prevent county assessors from mistakenly removing valid exemptions mid-year.
- Rule 610 (Cross-Reference Update): This is a purely technical cleanup. Because Rule 610 directly references the criteria in Rule 609, it must be adjusted to match the new full-year timeline terminology.
- Rule 618 (Irrigation Exemption Mechanism): This section is being completely deleted because it is entirely obsolete. A previous legislative session passed House Bill 329, which revoked Idaho Code Section 63-602N and created a completely separate mechanism pursuant to Idaho Code Section 63-3502C for managing kilowatt hour tax exemptions on irrigation equipment.
- Taxing District Splits (Successor Apportionment): To incorporate House Bill 722, a new Rule Section 418 is being added. It clarifies that when a school district, taxing unit, or urban renewal area splits into successor districts, the action will not be legally treated as a “dissolution” for tax reapportionment purposes. The rule establishes how existing allocation proportions will be divided among successor districts following a split. It also reinforces the existing treatment of consolidations, which serves as the underlying allocation framework from which successor district proportions are derived. Both components are necessary to ensure the proportional tax is not reapportioned to surviving districts after a dissolution.
