RE: 02.04.14 Rules Governing Beef Cattle Feeding Operations

Dear Mr. Oakey:

DEQ appreciates the opportunity to work with ISDA and provide comments on the draft text for 02.04.15 – Rules Governing Beef Cattle Feeding Operations. As you are aware, DEQ is pursuing delegated authority for the NPDES program in Idaho and as such is dedicated to coordinating efforts between our two agencies for the smooth implementation of both ISDA and DEQ rules regarding concentrated animal feeding operations.

DEQ respectfully submits the following comments for your consideration.

DEQ believes the addition of language from Idaho Code 22-4903 is necessary to ensure clarity regarding the facilities that these rules apply to.

# **001 TITLE AND SCOPE**

**01. Title**. The title of this chapter is "Rules Governing Beef Cattle Animal Feeding Operations." (4-6-05)

**02. Scope**. These rules shall govern the design, function, and management practices of waste systems on beef cattle animal feeding operations. The official citation of this chapter is IDAPA 02.04.15.000 et seq. For example this section's citation is IDAPA 02.04.15.001. <u>"Nothing in this rule affects the authority of the department of environmental quality to administer and enforce an IPDES permit for beef cattle animal feeding operations that discharge pollutants to waters of the U.S., including without limitation, the authority to issue permits, access records, conduct inspections and take enforcement actions. The provisions of this rule do not alter the requirements, liabilities, and authorities with respect to or established by the IPDES program."</u>

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DEQ requests that the reference to NPDES or IPDES permits be removed from this section. Idaho Code section 22-4907(1) was modified in the last legislative session to remove the references to CWA permits from the agency's inspection authority.

# **050 AUTHORITY TO INSPECT**

The Director is authorized to inspect any animal feeding operation that confines slaughter or feeder cattle in accordance with Title 22, Chapter 49, Idaho Code, to ensure compliance with these rules. The Director shall comply with the operation's biosecurity protocol so long as the protocol does not inhibit reasonable access to: (4-6-05)

**01.** Entry. Enter and inspect at reasonable times the premises or land application site(s) of a beef cattle animal feeding operation. (4-6-05)

**02.** Access to Records. Review or copy any records that must be kept in accordance with these rules.

**03.** Sample or Monitor. Sample or monitor at reasonable times, substances or parameters directly related to compliance with these rules or an NPDES or IPDES permit.

DEQ proposes that new subsections be added to the beef cattle rules. This new section addresses compliance with IPDES rules will greatly help to reduce confusion regarding the overlap between the ISDA programs and the IPDES program. The language is taken from the dairy environmental control act.

# 052. COMPLIANCE WITH IDAHO POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM RULES

01. Discharges to Waters of the U.S. The department of environmental quality shall be solely responsible and authorized to determine whether the discharge of pollutants from a Beef Cattle Feeding Operation to waters of the US is required to be authorized by an IPDES permit. The provisions of this rule do not define when a Beef Cattle Feeding Operation is required to obtain a permit for a discharge, do not exempt a Beef Cattle Feeding Operation from permitting requirements for such discharges or alter the authority of DEQ with respect to such discharges.

**02.** Upset Conditions. An upset condition does not excuse a person from the obligation to obtain an IPDES permit for the discharge of pollutants from a Beef Cattle Feeding Operation to waters of the United States.

# **RE:** Idaho Conservation League comments on rulemaking for 02.04.15 – Rules Governing Beef Cattle Animal Feeding Operations

Dear Mr. Oakey:

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the text for the draft rulemaking for 02.04.15 – Rules Governing Beef Cattle Animal Feeding Operations. Since 1973, the Idaho Conservation League has been Idaho's leading voice for clean water, clean air and wilderness—values that are the foundation for Idaho's extraordinary quality of life. The Idaho Conservation League works to protect these values through public education, outreach, advocacy and policy development. As Idaho's largest state-based conservation organization, we represent over 25,000 supporters, many of whom are interested in ensuring that Beef CAFO's in Idaho are adequately regulated so as to ensure the protection of Idaho's groundwater, surface water and air resources.

101.05 We note that the definition of "Best Management Practices" utilized in the draft rule text is not the same as the definition that was passed by the Idaho legislature in Senate Bill 1260. It is our understanding that statute language trumps rule language and that rule language should always be revised to mirror legislative language. To this end we ask that you true these up and that the S 1260 definition be used in these rules.

010.11 – Land Application. In the proposed definition, ISDA's use of the word "byproducts" creates ambiguity. In the dairy portion of S 1260, the legislature used the term "dairy byproducts." This definition in the Beef rules would be improved if ISDA mirrored the legislature's dairy related language and said, "beef CAFO byproducts."

010.12.a There is a typo in this subsection. "cows" is accidentally spelled "covws."

010.19 We note that the definition of "Nutrient management standard" utilized in the draft rule text is not the same as the definition that was passed by the Idaho legislature in Senate Bill 1260. We ask that you true these up and that the S 1260 definition be used in these rules.

010.22 There is a typo in this subsection. There should be comma between the words "individual" and "association."

010.29 There is a unintentional omission in this subsection. The word "state" needs to be added to the end of this definition so that it reads "or border upon the <u>state</u>."

012 – Prohibited Discharges. The language in this section provides that unauthorized discharges from sites "owned or controlled" by a beef CAFO are prohibited. We believe though that it the case that such discharges are also prohibited in the instances where the site is not owned or controlled by the beef CAFO. Thus, the draft rule language needs to be amended to insure that such discharges are prohibited, irrespective of who owns or controls the site.

# **AGENDA ITEMS**

# WELCOME

Dr. Scott Leibsle convened the meeting at 1:03 pm. After introductions, he explained that this rule is being changed to incorporate changes from the statutory amendment.

Dr. Leibsle explained the changes to the rule. The first incorporation by reference has been deleted because to define CAFOs the definitions were extracted from the CFR and included in the rule. The second incorporation by reference is now titled differently so that was changed. It is a copyrighted publication so it cannot be published but is available for sale.

In Section 010. Definitions, Beef Cattle Animal Feeding Operations had the CFR citation removed. The Best Management Practices definition is taken directly from the new statute. The Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation definition is from the CFR, but now included in the ISDA rule. Mary Anne Nelson recommended that we keep the phrase "Director will designate" in this definition.

In the definition for Land Application, the change should be rejected so that the original definition stays. Large and Medium AFOs are taken from the CFR definitions. Dr. Leibsle explained that since the CFR is no longer published annually, we are no longer citing it. Mr. Oakey suggested we need to outline the process for designating. It was pointed out that that process is in Section 040.

Do we need to have NPDES defined? Ms. Hurst suggested not. Nutrient Management Plan had the abbreviation (NMP) added. Process Wastewater has a hyphen added to the word process-generated. We have added Small AFO definition from the CFR. Unauthorized Discharge and Waters of the State definitions have been changed to coincide with the statute definition.

Under Section 011. Abbreviations, add IPDES. Idaho Pollutant Discharge Elimination System.

Mr. Oakey asked Ms. Nelson to explain the IPDES/NPDES process. She said that DEQ will submit their application to EPA in 22 days. The EPA will review it and do a statutory review. If accepted the first phase which will be municipal permits will start July, 2018. In July, 2019 individual permits will begin to be issued and in July, 2020 general CAFO permits will be issued. She explained that the EPA retains authority until then. Section 052 has been added at the request of the Idaho Cattle Association

and has been taken directly out of the statute.

Dr. Leibsle explained that Section 080. Compliance Orders. has been taken from statute. Mr. Oakey suggested that the whole change to that section be deleted, since who consults with whom is different. He recommended that we hold off making that change. Mr. Parks asked then why we would not wait for the other changes. Mr. Oakey explained that the others are so the rule complies with the statute change which went into effect in July, 2016. Ms. Hurst recommended holding off on changing Section 080.

Dr. Liebsle asked if there were any other comments or additional changes. Mr. Oakey commented that the changes to this rule are pretty straight forward. Ms. Nelson indicated that DEQ has been given permitting authority, but that they will rely on ISDA for inspections and reviewing NMPs. Mr. Oakey stated that if there is an enforcement issue on the Clean Water Act, it would be transferred to DEQ. He said inspection issues are still being worked out. He must go through the EPA manual in orders to figure that out. With NPDES, the EPA is solely responsible, but with the new agreement every facility that does not have an IPDES permit would have an inspection. Therefore, inspections would be anticipated annually. Mr. Parks asked if there was a rule requiring every CAFO to have a permit. Mr. Oakey said no.

Dr. Leibsle adjourned the meeting at 1:40 pm. Mr. Oakey thanked everyone for coming.

# NOTICE OF RULEMAKING - ADOPTION OF PENDING RULE

**DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY:** The following is a concise explanatory statement of the reasons for adopting the pending rule and a statement of any change between the text of the proposed rule and the text of the pending rule with an explanation of the reasons for the change.

The proposed rule change will make the rule consistent with the statutory revisions implemented by the 2016 Idaho Legislature.

There are no changes to the pending rule and it is being adopted as originally proposed. The complete text of the proposed rule was published in the October 5, 2016 Idaho Administrative Bulletin, Vol. 16-10, pages 31-35.

# 000. LEGAL AUTHORITY.

This chapter is adopted under the legal authority of Title 22, Chapter 1 and 49, Idaho Code. (3-16-01)

# 001. TITLE AND SCOPE.

# 010. **DEFINITIONS.**

The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this chapter. (3-16-01)

**01. Administrator**. The administrator of the Idaho State Department of Agriculture, Division of Animal Industries or his designee. (4-6-05)

**02. Animal**. Bovidae, ovidae, suidae, equidae, captive cervidae, captive antilocapridae, camelidae, and (3-16-01)

**03. Animal Feeding Operation**. A lot or facility where slaughter and feeder cattle or dairy heifers are confined and fed for a total of forty-five (45) days or more during any twelve (12) month period and crops, vegetation forage growth, or post harvest residues are not sustained in the normal growing season over any portion of the lot or facility. (4-6-05)

**04. Beef Cattle Animal Feeding Operation**. An animal feeding operation, as defined in 40 CFR Sections 122.23 (b)(1), (b)(2), (b)(4), (b)(6) or (b)(9), which confines slaughter and feeder cattle or dairy heifers. (4 - 6 - 05)(

**05. Best Management Practices**. <u>Practices aAs</u> defined in Title 22, Chapter 49, Idaho Code, or other practices, techniques, or measures <u>that which</u> are determined to be <u>reasonable precautions</u>, <u>are</u> a cost-effective and practicable means of preventing or reducing pollutants from point or non-point sources to a level compatible with state environmental goals, <u>including water quality goals</u> and <u>standards for water of the state</u>. Best management practices for water quality shall be adopted pursuant to the state water quality management plan, the Idaho ground water quality plan or Title 22, Chapter 49, Idaho Code.

**06. Compost**. A biologically stable material derived from the biological decomposition of organic matter. (3-16-01)

<u>07.</u> <u>Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation.</u> An AFO that is defined as a Large CAFO or as a Medium CAFO by the terms of this section and designated by the Director. Two or more AFOs under common ownership are considered to be a single AFO for the purposes of determining the number of animals at an operation, if they adjoin each other or if they use a common area or system for the disposal of wastes. (\_\_\_\_\_)

**0<u>8</u>7. Director**. The Director of the Idaho State Department of Agriculture or his designee. (4-6-05)

**098. Discharge**. Release of process wastewater or manure from a beef cattle animal feeding operation to waters of the state. (3-16-01)

10. Idaho Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (IPDES). Idaho Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (IPDES). Idaho's program for issuing, modifying, revoking and reissuing, terminating, monitoring and enforcing permits, and imposing and enforcing pretreatment requirements, under these rules and the Clean Water Act sections 307, 402, 318, and 405.

1109. Land Application. The spreading on, or incorporation of manure or process wastewater into the soil.

<u>12.</u> <u>Large Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation.</u> An AFO is defined as a Large CAFO if it stables or confines as many as or more than the numbers of cattle specified in any of the following categories:(

(4 - 6 - 05)(1 - 0)

**184.** Nutrient Management Standard. The 1999 publication by the United States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service, Conservation Practice Standard, Nutrient Management Code 590, or other equally protective standard approved by the Director. (3-16-01)

**195. Operate**. Confining and feeding slaughter and feeder cattle in the state of Idaho. (4-6-05)

**<u>2016</u>**. **Operator**. The person who has power or authority to manage, or direct, or has financial control of a beef cattle animal feeding operation. (3-16-01)

**<u>2117</u>. Person**. Any individual, association, partnership, firm, joint stock company, joint venture, trust, estate, political subdivision, public or private corporation, state, or federal governmental department, agency or instrumentality, or any legal entity, which is recognized by law as the subject of rights and duties. (3-16-01)

<u>2218.</u> Process Wastewater. Liquid containing beef cattle manure, <u>process-process-generated</u> wastewater and any precipitation which comes into direct contact with livestock manure and facility products or by-products.(<u>4 6 05</u>(

**1923. Runoff**. Any precipitation that comes into contact with manure, compost, bedding, or feed on a beef cattle animal feeding operation. (3-15-02)

**2024.** Slaughter and Feeder Cattle. All cattle except those cattle located on a dairy farm permitted by the Idaho State Department of Agriculture pursuant to IDAPA 02.04.14, "Rules of the Department of Agriculture Governing Dairy Waste." (4-6-05)

25. Small Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation. An AFO that is designated as a CAFO and is not a medium or large CAFO.

<u>2621.</u> Unauthorized Discharge. A discharge of process wastewater or manure from a beef cattle animal feeding operation to <u>state</u> surface waters of the state that is not authorized by a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit issued by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, or the release of process wastewater or manure from a beef cattle animal feeding operation, to waters of the state, that does not meet the

requirements of the these rules act or water quality standards.

272. Wastewater Storage and Containment Facility. That portion of a beef cattle animal feeding operation where manure or process wastewater is stored or collected. This may include corrals, feeding areas, waste collection systems, waste conveyance systems, waste storage ponds, waste treatment lagoons and evaporative ponds.(3-16-01)

**283.** Waters of the State. All <u>accumulations of water</u>, surface and <u>underground</u>, <u>water</u>-<u>natural and</u> artificial, public and private, or parts thereof which are wholly or partially within, which flow through or border upon located within the boundaries of the state.or boundary streams, rivers and lakes except for private waters as defined in Title 42, Chapter 2, Idaho Code. (3-16-01)(\_\_\_\_)
