

Hemp, CBD, and Animal Remedies



Hemp and hemp derivatives, like CBD, are not permitted in any animal feeds, but what about animal remedies?

Food VS Remedy

Animal feeds (including treats) are intended to provide nutrients animals need to survive. Animal Remedies (Dosage Form Animal Supplements) do not serve a nutritive purpose and are intended to affect the structure or function of the animal's body.

Cottage laws?

Unfortunately, Idaho's cottage laws do not apply to animal feed or remedy products.

What's Different About the Label?

- Brand and/or Product
 Name
- Intended Species

- Active Ingredients
- Inactive Ingredients
- Directions for Use*
- Company Name & Address
- Net Weight or Count

*Directions for use are not the same as feeding directions.

What's a Hemp Derivative?

Any compound or extract produced from hemp, e.g., THC, CBD, CBG, etc.

How much THC is permitted?

Pursuant to § 37-2705, no amount of THC is legal in any products in Idaho.



What animals can have a CBD remedy?

Animal remedies containing CBD are allowed in products for dogs, cats, and horses only. No other species are permitted.

What if a remedy does not contain any hemp or hemp derivatives?

Animal remedies that do not contain any hemp or hemp derivatives are exempt from registration as long as they are appropriately labeled. Animal Remedies are for non-food producing species only.
