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AGRICULTURE IN IDAHO

Idaho agriculture is diverse, abundant and rooted in our history. The state has over **22,400 farms and ranches** which produce more than **185 different commodities**. Idaho ranks in the top ten in the nation in over 20 of those commodities. Idaho is **fifth in the nation in farm GDP** as a percent of Total State GDP (3.29%). Agriculture remains a fundamentally important part of Idaho's economy, communities and way of life contributing:

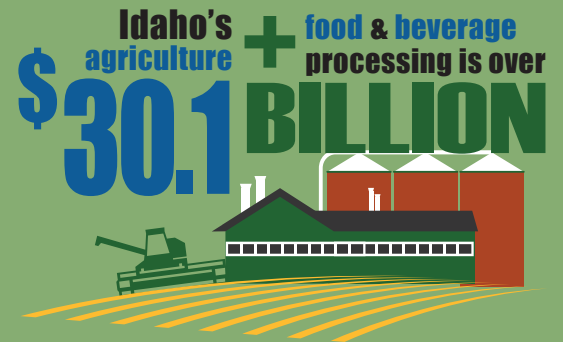

From fries to cheese to wine, Idaho is producing quality products to feed the world and fuel our state. Together, agriculture and food processing generates **17% of Idaho's total economic output in sales and 12.8% of GDP.**

Idaho seed production is recognized globally. Idaho grows **70% of the world's hybrid temperate sweet corn seed** and ranks among the leading suppliers of alfalfa, field bean, garden bean, and Kentucky bluegrass seed in the nation.

Idaho vegetable seed production also includes carrot, onion, turnip, lettuce and many more.
